

GUIDELINES FOR CLUB AWARDS

Window Display Awards

4-H clubs are encouraged each year to help Green County promote and celebrate National 4-H Week by putting up a display in a local business, school or library. The UW-Extension Office needs to be notified of displays by the Monday of National 4-H Week, and displays must remain up Monday through Sunday to be considered for prizes. The display is judged on creativity, neatness, educational value, visibility, and overall promotional effectiveness. Prizes by the 4-H Adult Leaders are: 1st place - \$25, 2nd place - \$15, and 3rd place - \$10.

Applications or qualifications for the following awards should be submitted at the same time as 4-H County Record Books are due to the county.

Club Major Emphasis

Each year, Green County 4-H clubs are encouraged to select a specific educational topic or community need, and then to dedicate their time, effort and creativity in planning and carrying out special activities related to that major club emphasis. Clubs are encouraged to submit a *Club Youth-in-Action/Major Emphasis Activity Form*, so that their Major Emphasis work can receive special county recognition.

4-H Secretary Awards

The purpose of this award is to encourage clubs to keep accurate records of monthly meetings, financial records, club calendar, members and projects, and to motivate members to participate in assembly of the club record. Recipients of the Secretary's Awards are selected on the overall quality of the Secretary's Book which is evaluated by the Green County 4-H Awards Committee.

4-H Historian Awards

The purpose of this award is to encourage clubs to keep a historical record of their club's members, leaders and activities, through pictures, journaling and newspaper articles. Recipients of the Historian Awards are selected on the overall quality of the Historian Book which is evaluated by the Green County 4-H Awards Committee.
