- About learning, exploring and having fun
- Open to ALL youth in Kindergarten (5K) through High School
 - Our youngest members (5K-2nd grade) can enroll in the Cloverbud project
 - Youth in 3rd grade and above can chose from 60+ hands-on project areas, including arts, animals, leadership, sciences and more
- Family focused – youth attend local club meetings with their parents and siblings, where they participate in decision-making, teamwork, and community service

Parents are encouraged to get involved as 4-H volunteer leaders
- Open to new enrollments all year, but most youth join between Sept. 1 – Nov. 1
- All 4-H members must be enrolled in a 4-H club by November 1st to be eligible to show their projects at the Green County Fair in July
